- ☞ “Identity Fraud is rampant. (‘Why be me, when I can be you?’) You need to shred any mail solicitations for credit. ‘Dumpster Divers’ will use them - they just change the address and *you’re* on the hook.
- ☞ “Call 1-888-STOPCALLS to cut off unsolicited phone calls.
- ☞ “Install outside motion lights and cut back big bushes - don’t give predators the advantage.
- ☞ “Bringing stuff to car when shopping: 1) Always look around. 2) If going back to the mall, move your car so no one knows you just put packages in your car.
- ☞ “Cell phone cameras are great for seeing you punch in your codes. Cover up!
