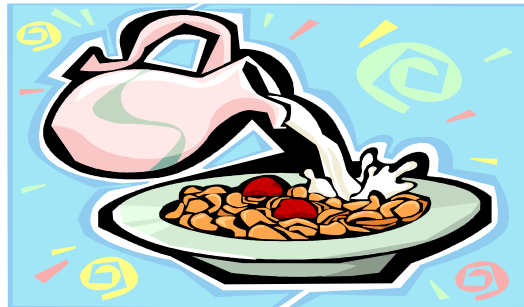



## KIWANIS CLUB OF WALNUT VALLEY
